Salvatorian Child Development - Orphanage Centre, Vavuniya

Rev Sr. Ranjana, Director, highlighted the digital needs of the orphanage.

Child Aid Lanka funded 3 laptops and a projector.

Project deliverables included:

- Basic computer functions training, including Microsoft Office
- Media presentations training
- Fun and engaging karaoke sessions using the projector
- Clothing bank donations





- Murunkan (Hostel)

There are approximately 40 students attending a local school and staying at this hostel. We **targeted the digital exclusion** that they experienced.

Child Aid Lanka funded a laptop and a projector.

The students benefited from a variety of classes, including media presentation training.





IT Classroom - Ilavalai

Nava Ranjan, a former teacher at Ilavalai Convent in the northern tip of Sri Lanka, urgently required support with educational resources for underprivileged students.

Child Aid Lanka funded 2 laptops, a projector and unveiled the IT classroom.

We heard directly from former students about what they have gone on to secure employment:

- Video Editor
- IT Administrator
- Videographer

One student produced a YouTube film within few hours.

Teaching English - Jaffna

Books distribution & teaching by our President Naomi Aruliah.

Child Aid Lanka coordinated the book donations.

We collected around 800 books from the UK and shipped them over to Sri Lanka. Our President engaged and supported students in reading English story books.





Don Bosco Infotech - Murunkan

This project focuses on breaking down barriers to digital exclusion of young people in remote areas of Sri Lanka.

Child Aid Lanka funded:

- √ 10 projectors
- √ 7 smart white boards
- ✓ Stage lights
- √ 40 laptops





Student Felicitations - St Patrick's College

This year, 17 students were successfully accepted at various universities across the country. We supported their hard work with a small gift towards their expenses.

Child Aid Lanka funded university study resources.

The students embrace their opportunities and the potential to achieve their aspirations.







What next for Child Aid Lanka?

- Recruit to experienced IT Teachers
- Recruit influential English Teachers
- Facilitate virtual classrooms, including smart boards and internet access

As projects evolve towards digital-hybrid delivery, the subsequent COST SAVINGS forecast includes:

- ✓ Reduced teacher travel costs
- ✓ Reduced consumable resources costs







Current Financial Requirement

The need is to setup TWO Hybrid smart classrooms for English and IT:

- Smart Boards x2 @ £1500 each = £3000
- Furniture, including desks, chairs, sound systems, server = £1000
- Internet charges for 12 months = £1000
- Laptops x30 = £3,800

Laptops have already been donated by US charity – North Caroline's Peace Foundation NCPF.
